

CUSCO RACING 2011 Rally Activities

Carrosser, Co., Ltd. has announced the motor sport activity plan of Cusco Racing, the works team of the Japanese motor sport manufacturer, in 2011. The team backs to FIA Asia-Pacific Rally Championship (APRC) again as the team's main target, but additionally Japanese Rally Championship (JRC) as series entrant too.

As already the team has announced to use Proton Satria Neo first time, 2010 Asia Cup winning team will tackle both APRC and Asia Cup using Group N4 machine, also JRC which meant the team will cover wide range of category from top level to entry level as team is seeking more appeal to motor sport or media globally.
